Leah, did you not notice how heavy the burden being carried by a Child of God? What about the blessing of a quiet moment? Did you notice the smile on the face of another? Did you not see the compassion and thoughtfulness of a nurse in the emergency room? I, too, live oblivious to my surroundings as if I am stepping off a curb into oncoming traffic. Lord, forgive me.
